What's The SCOOPP?

Due to the opioid overdose crisis in our communities, the Sumner County Health Department has created the Sumner County Opioid Overdose Prevention Program (SCOOPP) to review overdose causes, risks, and signs, as well as educate on the steps to take when witnessing and responding to an overdose. Education includes training on the use of naloxone, an opioid overdose reversal medication. In April we started presenting our program in Town Hall meetings across the county.

CDC, over 200 people die every day
from overdoses related to synthetic
opioids like fentanyl.
